



## **Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Development**

### **Pupil Questionnaire – 2016**

#### **Foundation**

We had very positive results from our pupil questionnaires with 100% positive response from all the questions asked. The children have been in school for about three weeks and are very happy in their new environments. Question 12 was left out, as we have not yet started formal home learning activities.

We intend to maintain this great start with positive behaviour management strategies, lots of praise and enabling environments/activities.

Parents will be encouraged to share their children's learning through reporting 'WOW' moments and celebrating their achievements – maintaining our positive start making secure links between home and school.

#### **Key Stage 1**

Analysis of the pupil questionnaire shows that throughout Key Stage 1, the overall majority of children have an exceptionally positive attitude towards Richmond Hill Primary Academy and the staff.

The only issue is with work in class. A high percentage of these pupils are low ability and thought that the work was too hard.

The results show that:

- 97 children (92%) are happy in school
- 101 children (96%) feel safe in school
- 101 children (96%) think children in their class behave well
- 102 children (97%) think other children are friendly in school
- 104 children (99%) like their teachers
- 105 children (100%) think their teachers are kind and fair
- 102 children (97%) think their teachers help them when they don't know what to do
- 104 children (99%) think their teachers help them when they are worried or have a problem
- 101 children (96%) think their teacher makes lessons fun
- 103 children (98%) think they learn a lot in class
- 92 children (87%) think the work is just right. Not too easy or too hard

- 99 children (94%) think they get the right amount of homework
- 102 children (97%) think bullying is always sorted by the teachers
- 102 children (97%) know what to do if they think they are being bullied

## Lower KS2

Analysis of the pupil questionnaire shows that throughout Lower KS2, the overall majority of children have an exceptionally positive attitude towards Richmond Hill Primary Academy and the staff.

The only issue is with homework, where a minority of pupils feel they get too much.

The results show that:

- 102 children (100%) are happy in school
- 102 children (100%) feel safe in school
- 102 children (100%) think children in their class behave well
- 102 children (100%) think other children are friendly in school
- 102 children (100%) like their teachers
- 102 children (100%) think their teachers are kind and fair
- 102 children (100%) think their teachers help them when they don't know what to do
- 102 children (100%) think their teachers help them when they are worried or have a problem
- 102 children (100%) think their teacher makes lesson fun
- 102 children (100%) think they learn a lot in class
- 102 children (100%) think the work is just right. Not too easy or too hard
- 85 children (85%) think they get the right amount of homework
- 102 children (100%) think bullying is always sorted by the teachers
- 102 children (100%) know what to do if they think they are being bullied

## Upper KS2

Analysis of the pupil questionnaires shows that throughout Upper KS2 the vast majority of pupils have a very positive attitude towards Richmond Hill Primary Academy, their fellow pupils and the staff.

Those children who expressed a "no" had a number of reasons, explained below, that were not necessarily negative.

The results show that:

- 110 children (100%) are happy in school
- 110 children (100%) feel safe in school. Some said they felt unsafe at one time, but no longer felt that way

- 109 children (99.09%) think that children behave well in class, the one child that didn't agree did not like others talking whilst working
- 109 children (99.09%) think that children are friendly in school. The one child that didn't was referring to not having enough other children to play with, on investigation many children said that they would and do play together
- 110 children (100%) said they like their teacher
- 110 children (100%) say their teachers are kind and fair. Fairness had to be explained to the children
- 110 children (100%) say their teachers help them when they are worried or have a problem - at first there were many "no" answers, but these were from pupils who had not had problems that needed to be resolved
- 110 children (100%) say their teachers make lessons fun - "as fun as they can be"
- 108 children (98%) say they learn a lot in class - the two that answered "no" explained that when they were in lessons they "knew it all"
- 106 children (96%) of children said that the work in class was just right. Not too easy, not too hard
- 104 children (94.45%) said they got enough homework
- 109 children (99.09%) think that bullying is always sorted by the teachers - the one child who said that it was not sorted in the past believes it would be sorted now
- 110 children (100%) know what to do if they think they are being bullied
