PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE – 10TH JANUARY 2025

Happy New Year to you all and many thanks on supporting our changed entry and exits this week as we had a wintery start to the new term. It has been a great first week back welcoming our children to the start of an exciting new spring term. We have a lot of updates and events coming up that we wanted to share with you. Heartfelt Condolences:

Our cherished colleague Miss Lewis, who has dedicated 25 years to our school and currently teaches Year 2, suffered a bereavement over the holidays with the sad loss of her partner James after a long and courageous battle with illness. As friends and colleagues, we have shared our love and condolences with Miss Lewis and her family during this very difficult time.

New School Business Manager:

We welcome Mrs Harmer to the school as our new Business Manager, she joins us from Sheffield University in a very similar role and is looking forward to developing in the role here at Richmond Hill.

American Diner Theme Experience:

A reminder that next week on **Thursday 16th January 2025**, we will be holding a special 'American Diner' themed lunch day. This will be a fun dining experience for <u>all</u> the children to enjoy, including Nursery who attend on Thursdays; even if your child normally has a packed lunch you can choose to book them a meal.

- Bookings to be completed via ParentPay as normal.
- Just to remind parents/carers that all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to universal free school meals, so you can book for them to enjoy the American diner experience without any extra cost.
- All children with a confirmed school meal booking for the 16th January will be able to choose
 on the day either beef burger or quorn hot-dog with ice-cream served with a brownie all you
 need to do is choose the 'all day breakfast' option which will still show on Parentpay (apologies
 it is not possible to change this to American Diner).



Parents' Evenings for pupils in Reception to Year 6:

Our Parents' Evenings will be taking place after February Half Term on Tuesday 25th February and Wednesday 26th February 2025:

- Telephone Appointments will take place on Wednesday 26th February 3.30-4.30pm

Nursery Parents' Evenings:

As our Nursery is nearly a full cohort of over 50 children, it is necessary for Miss Challinor to offer appointments over a longer time period.

- Nursery Face to Face Appointments in school are available at various times
 Monday 24th February 1.00pm-4.00pm and Tuesday 25th February 2.30pm-6.00pm
- Nursery Telephone Appointments will take place on Wednesday 26th February from 3.30-4.30pm

The **booking system** to make a Parents' Evening appointment (for all pupils Nursery to Year 6) will be **open** from **5.00pm on Monday 27th January** and will **close** at **9.00am on Monday 24th February 2025.** Please log on to your Arbor Parent Portal to make your booking. When the system opens, we would advise completing any bookings as soon as possible as office staff are term time only and will be unavailable during the half term break if you experience any difficulties.

Please enter/exit school via the main school entrance. You will be directed to your child's year group where one of the classrooms will be an allocated area to look through your child's work, before being invited into the adjoining classroom for your appointment at your allocated time.

Parents who have appointments in more than one year group can access other areas internally. Nursery - please follow the directions to the waiting area when arriving in the Foundation area. Please Note:-

If you experience problems completing a booking we would advise trying a different device such as a desktop computer/laptop/tablet and accessing the Arbor Parent Portal through the Arbor website – go to login-arbor.sc and not via the Arbor Parent App.

SEND Review Week – w/c 3rd March – parents of pupils with a SENd Support Plan will be contacted by their child's class teacher **before half term** to make a separate appointment. During this appointment you will have the first part discussing your child's parents' evening then lead into the review of your child's support plan. **You do not need to book an appointment via the Arbor Parent Portal.**

Statutory Assessment Dates:

This year's statutory assessment dates are shown below. It is crucial that children in these year groups attend school leading up to, and particularly during, the assessment period so they do not miss key review preparations and the statutory tests.

KS2 SATs

Year 6 pupils will be taking their Key Stage 2 SATs (Statutory Assessment Tests) from Monday 12th May to Thursday 15th May 2025. The SATs are nothing to worry about and are the same as other tests that our children have taken during their time at Richmond Hill, with the main difference being that they are marked externally and not by school staff. It is important our children just try their best and show the confidence and resilience they have developed over these years.



Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

The Phonics Screening Check for all Year 1 children and Y2 re-sits will take place during w/c 9th June 2025. We will be arranging a Parents' Meeting (virtually via Microsoft Teams) to give parents information about the Phonics Screening Check – details to follow.

Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check

The MTC tests for our Year 4 pupils will take place during w/c 2rd June and w/c 9th June. More details to follow.

Earrings, Jewellery and Nails:

Could we please remind parents about the expectations in school regarding pupils wearing earrings/ other jewellery and nail varnish/extensions. We are an active learning environment and it is unsafe for children to be wearing these items during the school day. We have seen a significant increase this week which has resulted in staff's time being taken away from pupils' learning in the classroom to deal with ensuring all pupils are safe and earrings are removed/covered appropriately.

- Earrings and other jewellery (except a simple watch) are not to be worn at school.
- If pupils come to school wearing jewellery we may ask them to remove it themselves, which may lead to accidental loss. For this reason it is much simpler if jewellery is not worn to school.
- If ears are newly pierced, pupils will be monitored and then we will ask them to remove earrings after six weeks. Earrings must be covered with tape during this six week period for health and safety reasons.
- Nail varnish and nail extensions are not appropriate for school and should not be worn.

World Book Day:

We look forward to another exciting World Book Day 2025 at Richmond Hill on **Thursday 6th March** and would like our pupils to come to school dressed as their favourite book character – or in non-uniform. If your child is coming to school dressed as a book character please remember to avoid anything which may hinder their ability to enjoy the day and not forgetting sensible shoes and a suitable coat. We have received book tokens from the World Book Day organisers to be distributed to every pupil, which will be sent out shortly.

Red Nose Day:

On **Friday 21st March** we will be celebrating Red Nose Day – Comic Relief and all our pupils can come to school with red noses/red nose t-shirts or just non-uniform. If you would like to make a donation which will be sent to Comic Relief, then the option to make a contribution will appear on ParentPay.

Easter:

Details about all our Easter activities including the dates and times of assemblies can be found at the end of this update.

Richmond Hill Collaborations:

We have recently been given a number of fantastic opportunities for our children to be involved in events with outside organisations. However, we are sometimes restricted by the event organisers regarding the targeted year groups and also the number of places.

Some of our Y5 children are going to visit Ridgewood school on 6th February to participate in an Arts International Event in partnership with the Cast Theatre. They will spend the day there completing a rehearsal, learning main sections and songs from Shrek. Transport and lunch costs are being met by Ridgewood School.

Some of our Y4 children are going to participate in this year's Big Sing which involves workshops in school with members of Opera North culminating in a performance with other schools from the region, accompanied by professional singers and members of the Orchestra of Opera North at the Dome.



Hill House School – we're looking forward to continuing our links with Hill House School with plans currently being finalised for some of our KS2 pupils to be involved in visits to Hill House for an experience day in Science as well as a Spelling Bee competition. Preliminary rounds of the Spelling Bee competition will be starting shortly in school to find our Richmond Hill winners who will go through to the Spelling Bee Final to be held at Hill House School.

Healthy Child Programme: Reception and Year 6 pupils

Parents of children in Reception and Year 6 were sent a letter from the School Nursing Team on 18th September 2024 giving details about the height and weight screening as part of the Healthy Child Programme. Parents did not need to do anything further. However, it was the responsibility of parents to inform the School Nursing Team direct if they wished to decline consent by 4th October 2024. We have arranged for the Team to come into school to carry out the screening on Tuesday 21st January.

Reception Admissions 2025/2026:

A reminder to current nursery parents/carers – please ensure you have completed your child's application for a place in Reception starting September 2025 available on the Doncaster Council website. **Closing date 15th January 2025**.

Teacher Led Tuition Sessions:

The current block of sessions for selected pupils started this week w/c 6th January and will be completed during w/c 3rd February. Any pupils to be invited to the next block of sessions which start w/c Monday 10th March will be sent details by email.

Term Dates 2025/2026:

We usually follow the same pattern as Doncaster Council, but details of Richmond Hill's training days have yet to be confirmed and should be released after Easter. Once finalised we will ensure parents/carers receive a copy.

<u>Year Group Assemblies: All Year Groups</u> - Parents and Carers are invited to join us in the main school hall accessible via the main entrance to celebrate pupils' learning. Assemblies will be 30 minutes duration (approx.). All children should wear their school uniform as usual.

Easter Hats: Nursery, Reception and KS1 - Pupils are asked to create an Easter Hat which will be worn for their assemblies – these are to be created at home and brought into school on the specified day.
