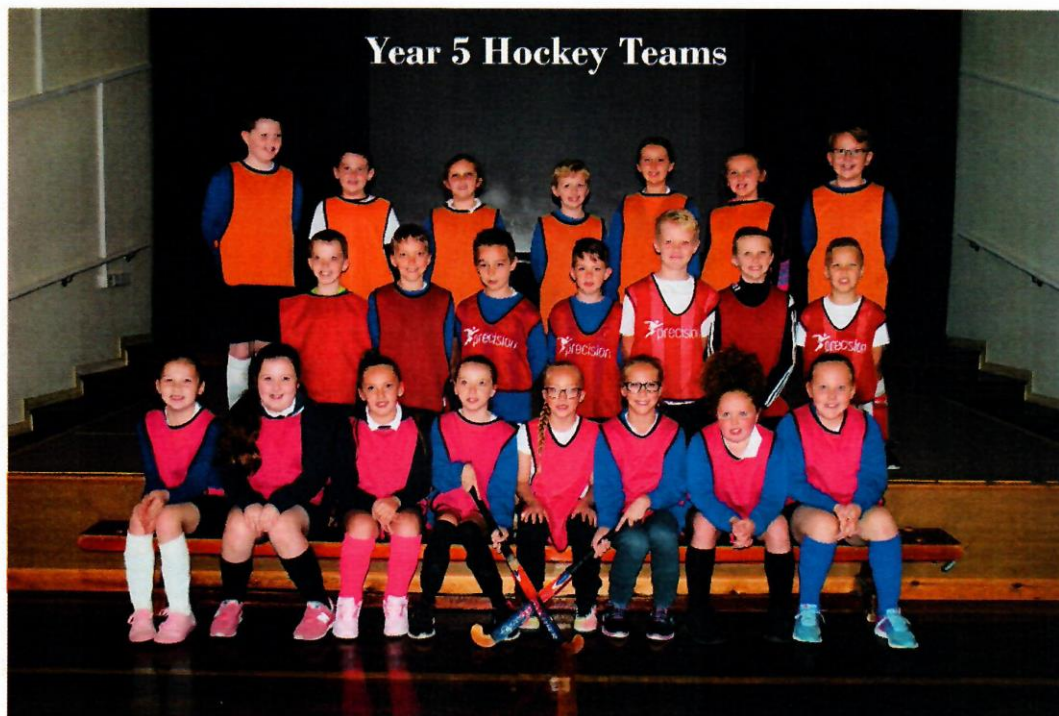
Year 3 and Y4 Football at the Keepmoat Stadium Doncaster.
